Word of God. When tempted by the devil, He quoted Scripture. Likewise, I encourage you all to enter into this Holy Lent armed with a disciplined

study of the Word of God. If you don't already do so, consider cultivating a new practice of praying the Daily Office and regular personal study of the Word of God this Lenten season. If you need resources or help on how to do this, feel

free to talk to me; we can set up a time for me to help teach you how to pray the Daily Office and give you some tips and advice how to make it a habit in your life.

Lastly, as we look to Jesus as our Master and example to follow, we see that after His season in the wilderness He then began His public ministry. My hope is that this Lenten season we

# **Deacon's Corner**

# **Meaning**: We are here to have a relationship with God and to worship him.

The class "I Don't Have Enough Faith to be an Atheist" talks about five consequential questions

of life. They are:

1. Origin—Where did we come from?

Greetings!

2. Identity—Who are we?

3. Meaning—Why are we here?

4. Morality—How should we live?

5. Destiny—Where are we going?

These questions boil down to this: either God exists or he doesn't. The class gives evidence that God exists. As Christians we believe that God does exist and that Jesus, His Son, the second Person of the Trinity, humbled himself and took on human flesh and died for our sins on the cross.

The season of Lent is a time to pray, fast, reflect, and repent for the sins we have committed and that Jesus died for. I think these five questions might be a good Lenten discipline to use for praying, reflecting, and repenting—because each one points to the fact that God does exist and that we were made for a purpose that we have not fulfilled.

**Origin**: We came out of the dust of which God breathed life in us.

**Identity**: We should identify with Christ and what he did for us, hence we are *Christ*ians.

Morality: We are to live by God's wisdom and not

**Destiny**: It lies in Christ that we shall be resurrected to continue to have the relationship that God made us for.

So perhaps a good Lenten practice is to focus on the core principles of each of these five questions and how we have strayed from them and wandered into sin—so that by doing so we may return with Christ's help and have the relationship that the Father in heaven wants to have with us.

The Great Litany that will be sung on the first Sunday of Lent is a good reminder of how to meditate and reflect on these five questions with repentance prayer and fasting. This gives us a deeper and fuller experience during Lent which will make Easter even more full and vibrant.

These five questions, when in relation to whether God exists or not, have a deep impact on the way we act. If there is no God we can act differently than if there *is* a God; and that is the conflict of the world today. I pray that during this Lenten season you will pick a practice that will help in your relationship with God, leading to a stronger and more rewarding connection.

# Taizé Scriptural Stations of the Cross

Friday, March 13 at 7:00 p.m.

Fourteen Stations beginning with the Prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus became distressed and "deeply grieved, to the point of death" (Matthew 26:38 NASB).

- Based on a devotion by Pope John Paul II
- A seated meditation in our candlelit sanctuary in lieu of a physical procession
- Each station is represented by classical art
- Each station has a reading, reflective silence, a prayer, and a song
- Contemplative five-minute silence after the last station, before the final song and closing prayers. We pause at the silence of the tomb after Christ's body is laid to rest—as we grieve for His suffering and death, and in gratitude for our Lord's sacrifice.



It is our prayer that this special Taizé Stations of the Cross service will bless you and help you to reflect more profoundly on our Lord's Passion this Lenten season.

Come pray with us on March 13. God will meet you in the songs and in the silence.

If you or someone you know need healing but cannot physically make it to the Church, we can bring the Sacrament to you.


**All are welcome** to come and share in the healing service as the body of Christ. Time and place will be announced in the Sunday bulletin or via email. ◆


